

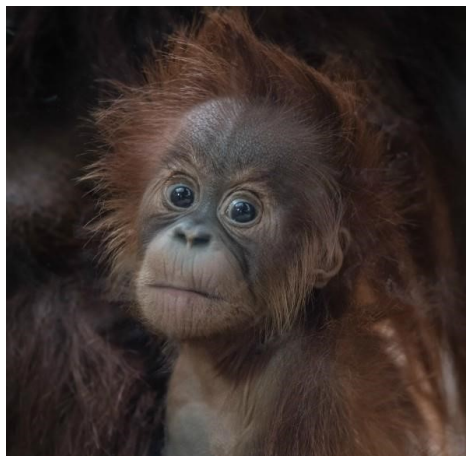

KESUMA

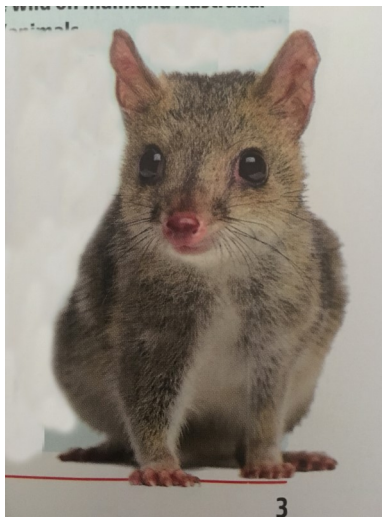
This baby Orangutan was born in Chester Zoo to Emma and it was her 5th baby. Chester Zoo is doing a huge amount to save one of the worlds most endangered great apes. Planting Palm Oil forests in Sumatra is destroying habitat and massively threatening this species and it is thought there are only 6500 remaining in the world.. The zoo is mounting a campaign to make production of Palm Oil sustainable.





AMJAN

This baby elephant was born on May 17th 2018 to his Mother, Thi Hi Way, at Chester Zoo after 25 months gestation. After 12 weeks old he was still learning to manage his own weight.



THE EASTERN QUOLL

For the first time in over 50 years, this little marsupial has been born in the wild in Australia where 20 were released into the BOODEREE NATIONAL PARK. Rangers have found three females are each carrying five joeys in their pouches.
